## Music Notes

Today's offertory anthem is a very special setting which is wonderfully suitable for All Saints' Sunday. The text was written by the great 17<sup>th</sup> century hymn writer Isaac Watts, who composed the words to a great many favorite hymns in the Hymnal 1982, and his poetry has continued to inspire throughout the centuries. Contemporary British composer, James Whitbourn found inspiration in the words of this particular poem and wrote this divinely serene music to match. As a composer, Whitbourn's music is highly inventive, often taking inspiration from varying cultural and religious sources, including a portion of Anne Frank's diary set to music, a musical portrayal of the life of C.S. Lewis, and music for a commemoration of 9/11. His career, though sadly quite short, was a fruitful one – he was known for his work as a composer of choral music, film music, conducting, producing, lecturing, and TV/radio presenting, among many other things. He sadly passed away this past March, though his legacy continues strong.

This piece invites us to remember all the souls that we have loved and lost, asking for faith to see them in glory, and for courage to follow in their footsteps
