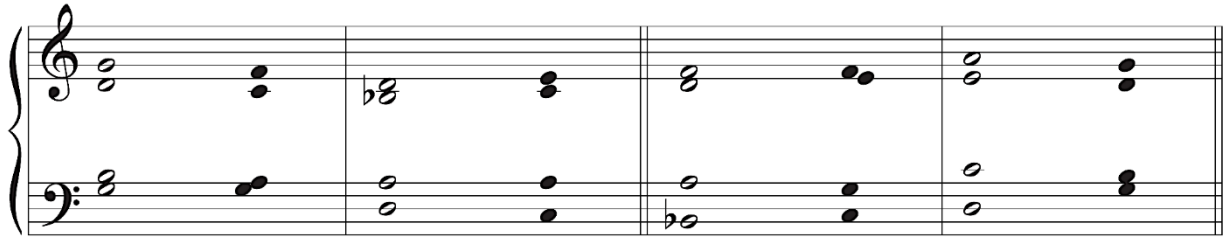

“Holy Waiting in Advent” At this forum, Rev. Julianne will present the spirituality of Advent and we’ll share ideas and practices for spiritual growth and deepening during this holy (and busy) season.

“Ero cras” (Latin for Tomorrow I will be [there]) This forum will explore the tradition of the O Antiphons used in the Divine Office and the Holy Eucharist in the seven days leading up to Christmas Eve. Specifically, we will look at the spiritual ideals and themes that they present, and how these might guide our spiritual lives beyond the Advent season.

Music notes:

The season of Advent brings with it a rich variety of musical and liturgical traditions which serve to prepare worshippers for the coming of Christ, both in the sense of the birth at Christmas, and of the second coming. One of these great traditions comes in the form of the 'Great' antiphons of Advent, also known as the 'O' Antiphons. Dating from the Middle Ages, they are traditionally used in vespers (or evening prayer) for the seven days leading up to Christmas. They draw on prophetic passages from the Old Testament to proclaim the coming of Christ as the fulfillment of those prophecies. Each begins with the vocative 'O', and the first letters of the Latin titles of each, when read in reverse, spell ERO CRAS – meaning, 'tomorrow I will come.' The choir will sing these antiphons (in English) each week throughout the season of Advent as an introit at the start of the service and at communion. The well-known hymn 'O come, O come, Emmanuel' is also a paraphrase of these same verses.
