The rabble among them had a strong craving; and the Israelites also wept again, and said, “If only we had meat to eat! We remember the fish we used to eat in Egypt for nothing, the cucumbers, the melons, the leeks, the onions, and the garlic; but now our strength is dried up, and there is nothing at all but this manna to look at.”

Moses heard the people weeping throughout their families, all at the entrances of their tents. Then the LORD became very angry, and Moses was displeased. So Moses said to the LORD, “Why have you treated your servant so badly? Why have I not found favor in your sight, that you lay the burden of all this people on me? Did I conceive all this people? Did I give birth to them, that you should say to me, ‘Carry them in your bosom, as a nurse carries a sucking child,’ to the land that you promised on oath to their ancestors? Where am I to get meat to give to all this people? For they come weeping to me and say, ‘Give us meat to eat!’ I am not able to carry all this people alone, for they are too heavy for me. If this is the way you are going to treat me, put me to death at once—if I have found favor in your sight—and do not let me see my misery.”

So the LORD said to Moses, “Gather for me seventy of the elders of Israel, whom you know to be the elders of the people and officers over them; bring them to the tent of meeting, and have them take their place there with you.”

So Moses went out and told the people the words of the LORD; and he gathered seventy elders of the people, and placed them all around the tent. Then the LORD came down in the cloud and spoke to him, and took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders; and when the spirit rested upon them, they prophesied. But they did not do so again.

Two men remained in the camp, one named Eldad, and the other named Medad, and the spirit rested on them; they were among those registered, but they had not gone out to the tent, and so they prophesied in the camp. And a young man ran and told Moses, “Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp.” And Joshua son of Nun, the assistant of Moses, one of his chosen men, said, “My lord Moses, stop them!” But Moses said to him, “Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the LORD’s people were prophets, and that the LORD would put his spirit on them!”

For truly I tell you, whoever gives you a cup of water to drink because you bear the name of Christ will by no means lose the reward. “If any of you put a stumbling block before one of these little ones who believe in me, it would be better for you if a great millstone were hung around your neck and you were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to stumble, cut it off; it is better for you to enter life maimed than to have two hands and to go to hell, to the unquenchable fire. And if your foot causes you to stumble, cut it off; it is better for you to enter life lame than to have two feet and to be thrown into hell. And if your eye causes you to stumble, tear it out; it is better for you to enter the kingdom of God with one eye than to have two eyes and to be thrown into hell, where their worm never dies, and the fire is never quenched.

Music notes:

We are very pleased to welcome Helena Dixon to play the cello in today's worship service – thank you Helena for your time and talent in offering your beautiful music today!

Today's offertory anthem is a very extroverted and energetic setting of verses from Psalm 81 by English composer Sydney Campbell. This short piece features angular and very rhythmic musical phrases which serve to amplify the already jubilant words of the psalm. You may even notice a bit of text painting around the line 'blow up the trumpet,' during which both the choir and the organ mimic the sound of a trumpet. The final extended alleluia ends the piece with a dramatic flair, making this anthem perfectly suitable for our Celebration Sunday. The same psalm also served as the inspiration for the Fanfare by John Cook played at the opening voluntary.

Today's communion anthem is a famous musical setting of words by the 17th century playwright and poet, Jean Racine. The music was composed by Fauré, who is known most today for his charming instrumental compositions, as well as a good amount of sacred choral music; most famously, his Requiem. This piece was his first significant composition, written when he was about 18, and it has since become a perennial favorite of choirs around the world. Its enduring popularity must be due to Fauré's clearly inspired and beautifully subtle ability to set these powerful words, which are a prayer of both praise and supplication expressing a serene faith in God's generous mercy. The addition of cello particularly helps bring this beautiful melody to life, wafting upward as an offering to God.
